Annually we host a seminar in Denmark. Usually this an event is taking place in Marts-April, but since Covid-19, the seminar have been somewhat irregular. The last two years, the CAA DK event has been held in fall, but as of 2023 will be a spring event again. This is in part to accommodate towards the international CAA conference, but also to create an event possible for different special-interest-groups to have general assemblies in the beginning of the year.

The CAA DK event has a rotation principle between being hosted in different venues switching between being in Jutland, Funen or Sealand. This is done to accommodate necessary distance to travel. Since 2020, the seminar is hosted both physically and virtually, meaning attendees at the seminar have increased. People who have a greater distance of travel attends the virtual seminar, and people in the near vicinity attends in person. This works very well, because it creates a good atmosphere for discussion, and bringing people closer across greater distances. The price of attending the seminar also varies in relation to attending in person or digital. Price of the seminar is to cover expenses for rent of venue and accommodation during the day. The one-day seminar is nonprofit.

Besides the annual seminar, CAA DK is also highly focused on creating special-interest-groups on different topics in relation to computational, digital and data driven archaeology. The steering committee has a particular focus on QGIS with a connection to national databases for archaeological data.
